Course description:	<p>This course will introduce students to the legal side of business. Some of the most important topics are contracts, dispute resolution, organization of business units and legal rules in international business. In this function, the course addresses the historical-legal aspects, highlighting the traditional and contemporary legal-formal sources. Contracts, their meaning, forms, types and connections occupy a central place. Also, the aspects of physical and legal entities, their formation, types and legal basis of their functioning are treated by comparing it with other branches of economics. The main focus will be on developing students' analytical skills to recognize and anticipate legal problems before they arise, in order to avoid them in advance.</p>
Course aims:	<p>The objective of this module is to provide students with knowledge and skills that they can apply at work as well as basic knowledge of inter-business legal relations. It also instructs students on how to organize a research or study, as well as the reality of doing a research, highlighting the difficulties that are most often encountered.</p>
Learning outcomes:	<p>This course will prepare students to learn the legal rules applicable in Kosovo and internationally. The results expected from students after the successful completion of this course are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Understanding the nature of legal issues faced by businessmen; ▪ Understanding the basic elements of inter-legal legal relations; ▪ Understanding the methods for preliminary identification of possible legal problems in the business environment in the country and internationally; ▪ Solving potential problems in their favor.
