



**Summary report of the quality assessment by students

Summary quality assessment report

From the summary report presented in table no. 1 within the scope of program evaluation, namely teaching and learning, referring to the table, it is noted that there was a slight increase in the academic year 2024/2025, compared to the academic year 2023/2024. Also, an increase is observed in the evaluation of academic staff, based on the table below, we see that the result is satisfactory because we have a slight increase from the previous year.

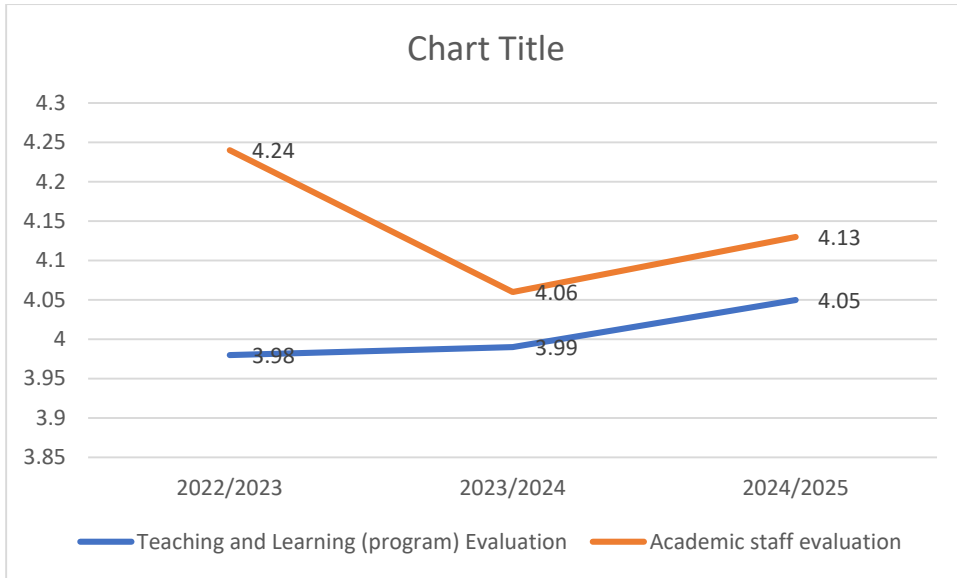


Figure no. 1 Quality assessment trend by field

1.1 Program evaluation report for the academic year 2023/2024

The program evaluation was conducted through questionnaires divided into 2 sessions: Teaching and Learning Evaluation which contains 21 components. Usually this evaluation is conducted once within an academic year and the evaluation is done by the students of the respective program. The questions for the two sessions were mainly constructed in the form of statements and their evaluation was done according to the Likert scale (1 - I don't know; 2 - I disagree completely; 3- I partially agree; 4-I agree; and 5- I completely agree). The results of the evaluations of these sessions are presented in this report through tables no. 2, and 3.
